

No Dolphins



Scotland is a wonderful country, filled with amazing wildlife and beautiful countryside

On the north east coast, the Moray Firth is a good site to see pods of dolphins swimming and feeding. You can go to the mouth of the river Spey and watch the osprey fishing in the river. Up in the Quiraing, north of Portree on the Isle of Skye there are golden eagles. The sunset behind the Cuillin mountains from the beach at Applecross, the peaceful seclusion of Loch Maree, the sleeping warrior which is the Isle of Arran, the mystery of standing stones at Callanish or the Ring of Brodgar.

But sometimes you can go dolphin watching and not see any dolphins. It might be raining or low mist when you are at Loch Maree or Brodgar. You may spend the day in the Quiraing and read lots of social media posts about the eagles flying over the Cuillin. Wildlife is wild, it isn't tame, it won't appear just when you

want it to. The mountains and lochs are still there, the standing stones are still standing, even if you can't see them.

Is it like this for us with God?

We've been told God is with us, we have heard the reports of God doing great things, but we aren't seeing it. We went to God's house once, years ago, and we didn't see God.

In the bible the apostle James wrote these words, "draw near to God and he will draw near to you". You won't see an osprey in Craiglockhart Dell, you must draw near to Perthshire or Speyside. You probably won't see dolphins in the Moray Firth if you only go once and spend five minutes looking all the time thinking about where you are going to go next.

The good news is that Jesus is God with us, Emmanuel, every day not only at Christmas. If we slow down and look for him we will see him and know his presence with us. If we come to worship expecting to meet God then we shall meet him. Experiencing the presence of God isn't only about our emotions, when we read God's word in the bible his Holy Spirit is with us, whether we feel it or not. When we pray God always notices us praying, God always hears our prayers – perhaps especially when he doesn't answer us in the way we want him to answer.

Go to the Moray Firth, there are dolphins there, and when you get to see them it is magical. Go to worship, open your bible and read it, take a moment of quiet and draw near to God. He is there, he is already waiting for you.

Knit and crocket our way to a better world

We're participating in 'Hold the Red Line', a craftivism project organised by North Sea Knitters. We'll be making red 'scarves' to be joined together in a continuous Red Line as long as possible, showing that this is where we draw the line on yet more new gas and oil exploration.

The North Sea Knitters have great plans afoot to use this Red Line on various occasions in the Autumn, so there is plenty of time to make your contribution. The width of each scarf is to be 15 cm and suggested length 1.5m, symbolising the 1.5 degree global warming limit promised by world leaders at the Paris Agreement in 2015. The eventual plan is to repurpose the strips as cosy scarves.

Christine in the Eco Team will be happy to collect in the scarves and take them to wherever they need to be . So please take your knitting needles and crochet hooks and join us! Forge Evening


Thursday 22nd August 7.30pm -Craiglockhart Church

Look forward with Hope – a reflection on a grand day out by John Hume


